Basic facts about Middlesbrough


This report provides a summary of the latest available information on the demographic and socioeconomic make-up of the 20 2015 election Wards in Middlesbrough. It looks at the population structure and provides information on the economic, housing and educational achievement of each 2015 election Ward.

Geography and population

Here is a breakdown of Middlesbrough giving the area, population size and gender split of each 2015 election Ward. In terms of area, Middlesbrough is ranked 7 out of the 7 Unitarys within the North East Region, and is ranked 50 out of all 56 Unitarys in England.

The total area of Middlesbrough is 5,387 hectares. The 2015 election Ward with the largest area is Nunthorpe, representing 12.33% of the total area of the Unitary.

The most densely populated 2015 election Ward is Park with 60.50 persons per hectare, the least densely populated 2015 election Ward is Stainton and Thornton with 4.67 persons per hectare.



The total resident population of Middlesbrough is 138,412. The 2015 election Ward with the largest population is Newport, representing 8.27% of the total resident population of Middlesbrough.



Longlands and Beechwood is the 2015 election Ward with the highest number of households (1,566) with dependent children in the Unitary and Stainton and Thornton is the 2015 election Ward with the lowest number of households with dependent children (254).


Newport 2015 election Ward has the highest number of Black / African / Caribbean /Black British residents in Middlesbrough.

Housing

There are 57,203 households in Middlesbrough, this chart shows the households of each 2015 election Ward in Middlesbrough broken down by tenure. Brambles and Thorntree 2015 election Ward has 1,220 households rented from the council, which is the highest number for any 2015 election Ward in Middlesbrough.

Longlands and Beechwood 2015 election Ward has 1,225 households of other types of social renting, which is the highest number for any 2015 election Ward in Middlesbrough.








Education

The 2011 Census recorded the educational achievement of residents; this chart shows the proportion of residents split by each 2015 election Ward reporting to have no qualifications.

Park End and Beckfield 2015 election Ward has the highest percentage of residents in Middlesbrough who have no qualifications (34.43%) compared to 29.90% for Middlesbrough as a whole.

Health

This chart shows the general health of residents by each 2015 election Ward in Middlesbrough, as self-reported in the 2011 Census. Longlands and Beechwood 2015 election Ward has the highest percentage of residents in Middlesbrough who report they are in very bad health (2.8%).
