A66 eastbound exit slip road at Middlehaven Interchange	Full length.
Cargo Fleet Road	Full length.
Commercial Street	Prohibition of westbound traffic to the west of the Gray Street junction.
Dockside Road	From its junction with Marsh Road (adjacent to Whitehouse Level Crossing) for a distance of approximately 200 metres in an easterly direction.
Heath Road	Full length.
Lower East Street	Westbound traffic only between the Gray Street and Durham Street junctions.
Marsh Road	Full length.
Vulcan Street	Prohibition of northbound and southbound traffic to the north of the Commercial Street junction
